

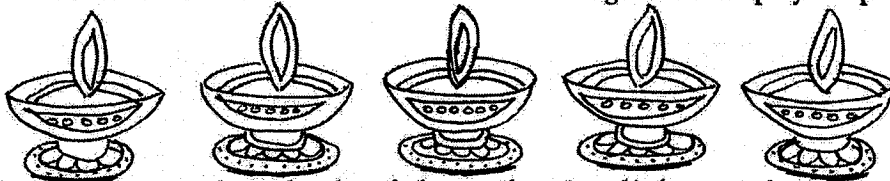

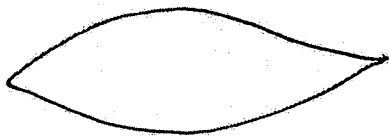

1x per student

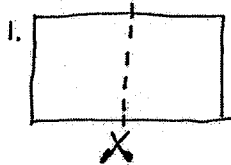


students to glue this flame onto their oil lamp sheet

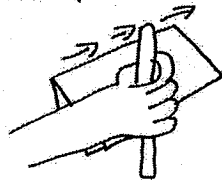


BLM 5 DIWALI

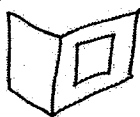
Purchase coloured card, A4 size, and cut into half to make two A5 size pieces.



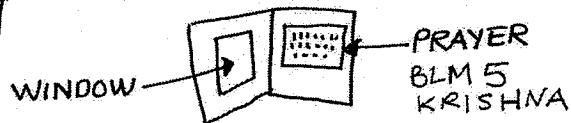
2. Fold A5 piece in half. Use a knife handle to score down fold.



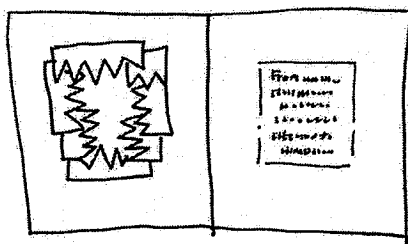
3. cut a window into front of card
